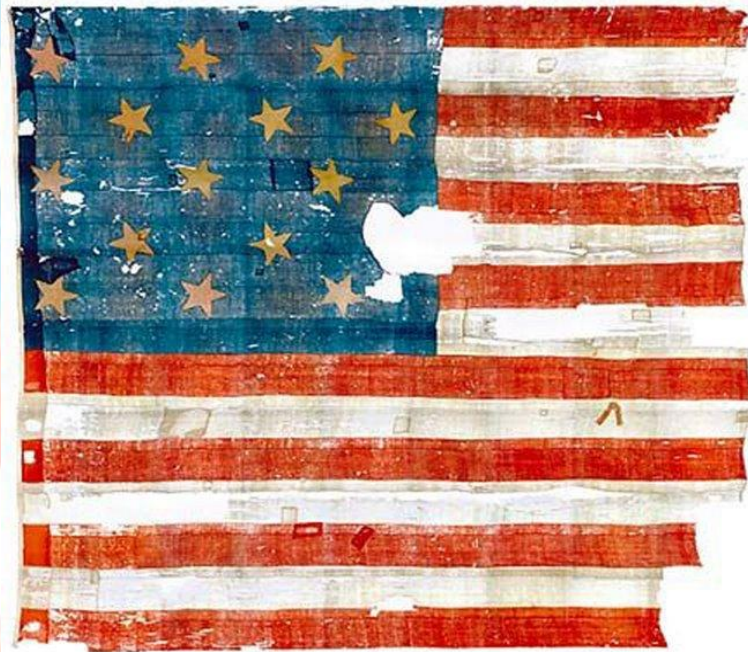

# “The Star Spangled Banner” Bicentennial Celebration 1814 – 2014

On the weekend of September 13 and 14<sup>th</sup>, a historic 38-star flag from 1877, with its distinctive gold fringe, will be on one-time only display. This flag, from the museum's collections, was a gift from Richard and Esther Davis in 1976, the year of the U.S. Bicentennial. The flag will be completely unfurled and on view from 1pm to 4pm on both days. A very unique chance to see one of our rarely viewed artifacts.
